

A first for the Cloisters - a Jewish exhibit from Medieval times. This will be a unique opportunity to have Met lecturer, Esther Goldman, guide us through the special Colmar exhibit as well as the historic Tapestries Room and the Gardens.

The Colmar Treasure, a cache of jeweled rings, brooches, and coins—the precious possessions of a

Jewish family of medieval Alsace — was hidden in the fourteenth century in the wall of a house in Colmar, France. Discovered in 1863 and on view in an exhibition at The Met Cloisters, the Colmar Treasure revives the memory of a once-thriving Jewish community that was scapegoated and put to death when the Plague struck the region with devastating ferocity in 1348–49.





Helping Women and Girls Perform When it Counts



Sian Beilock, Cognitive Scientist & President of Barnard College of Columbia University
Princeton Public Lecture Series

A cognitive scientist by training, Dr. Beilock studies how people crumble or do well under pressure, and what psychological tools help them perform at their best.

In her research, Beilock focuses specifically on success in math and science for women and girls, and how performance anxiety can either be exacerbated or alleviated by teachers, parents, and peers.

She explores the brain and body factors that influence skill learning and performance, as well as how simple psychological strategies can be used to ensure success in high-stakes situations ranging from test-taking and public speaking to athletics.

Dr. Beilock, President of Barnard College, has a bachelor's degree in cognitive science from the University of California, San Diego, and doctorates in kinesiology and in psychology from Michigan State University. She has written two books, published more than 100 papers and has received funding from the National Science Foundation.

3 Historic Houses All in a Row

Not for nothing is New Jersey, and especially our area, called the "Crossroads of the Revolution."

On this glorious autumn day we are going to visit 3 historic houses in our vicinity, with refreshments at 2 of them. Our docent-led tours start at the Wyckoff-Garretson House in Somerset, which dates to 1730.

Next stop is the Abram Staats House in South Bound Brook, c. 1740. Not only is it charming in and of itself, but it was home to General Baron von Steuben during the Middlebrook encampment, 1778–1779.

Our exciting, informative morning will conclude at the newly restored Buccleuch Mansion in New Brunswick. The house was originally built in 1739 by Anthony White, son-in-law of Lewis Morris, a colonial governor of New Jersey. White built the house for his bride Elizabeth Morris. Their son Anthony Walton White sided with

the revolutionaries against the King in the American Revolutionary War. The house is decorated with Federal and Victorian furnishings, many of which belonged to the Scott family, owners during much of the 19th century.

Helen Frankenthaler Prints: Seven Types of Ambiguity

Docent-Led Tour of Art Exhibit at Princeton U. Art Museum

Helen Frankenthaler was among the most influential artists of the mid-20th century. Frankenthaler was influenced by Abstract

Expressionist painting practices, but developed her own distinct approach to the style. She invented the "soak-stain" technique, in which she poured turpentine-thinned paint onto canvas. This new approach gave rise to the Color Field Painting movement in American art: marked by airy compositions of pure color which gave an entirely new look and feel to the surface of the canvas. In the late 60s Frankenthaler began working at a printmaking workshop on Long Island and she turned her attention to print media, most notably woodcuts, in which she achieved the quality of painting, in some cases replicating the effects of her soak-stain process. This exhibit marks the progress of her work during her time working at the workshop.

In an era when women, apart from singers, almost never performed in public or composed, Clara Schumann did both. She was a child prodigy who developed into a virtuoso pianist. She distinguished herself as the foremost interpreter of her husband Robert's work, but she was also a primary force in reintroducing eighteenth-century keyboard music to the public.

She was the first musician to play by memory which has become the standard. With Robert, the great love of her life, she had eight children and her performing career supported the family throughout their marriage. Robert's composing took precedence over her's. Thus, her compositions remained unknown until the second half of the twentieth century. Many are still unpublished and owned by private collectors, so we still cannot appreciate the full extent of her compositional achievements. The Program includes musical works composed by Clara Schumann, Robert Schumann, and Johannes Brahms who was a dear friend to Clara after the early death of her husband.





Frida Kahlo and Diego Rivera - Mexico's Art Couple

- An Art in the Afternoon Presentation by Clancy & Retz

Frida Kahlo (1907-1954), daughter of a Mexican woman and a German Jewish immigrant, was born before her time. Feminist, political activist, and daring artist, she pushed the boundaries of her day in her art. Her life was fraught with difficulties; polio at age 9 which withered one leg, and as a college student she suffered a horrible accident in which she was impaled by a rail during a bus and trolley crash. These misfortunes and their continuing effects greatly influenced her life and her painting. Today she is considered the greatest Mexican Artist. She used the symbolism and style of the indigenous Mexican culture and transformed it to her purposes. Kahlo's husband, Diego Rivera (1886–1957) is a loud presence on the art historical stage. With devout political principles and a turbulent romantic history, he was at once husband and paladin of Frida Kahlo, advocate and adversary of Stalin's Soviet Union, and liberator and traitor of Leon Trotsky.
